Burlingame, CA, November 6, 2009 – **Music at Kohl Mansion** continues its 27th annual series of chamber concerts at the historic Kohl Mansion with the Kohl debut of the **Philharmonia Baroque Chamber Players** and oboist **Marc Schachman** on Sunday, December 13th, 2009 at 7 pm. Drawn from San Francisco’s own Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra, These internationally-known period-instrument and chamber music specialists (**Kati Kyme** and **Lisa Weiss**, violins; **Anthony Martin**, viola; and **William Skeen**, cello) individually perform in the top echelon of early music ensembles such as Orchestra of the 18th Century, the Bach Ensemble, Artaria Quartet, Smithsonian Chamber Players, Arcadian Academy, the Göttingen Festival Orchestra, and Musica Angelica. years of musical collaboration in Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra, American Bach Soloists, and a long list of renowned chamber ensembles, these four Bay Area players have enjoyed decades of friendship and shared experience. Their history as both colleagues and friends endows the quartet with an unusual commonality of musical language and gesture, and provides a strong foundation for a unique and original ensemble voice.

One of the world's leading performers on early oboes, **Marc Schachman** is a founding member of some of America's foremost period instrument chamber groups—The Aulos Ensemble (1973), The Amadeus Winds (1983), and The Helicon Winds (1994). He has performed as principal oboist and soloist with the Philharmonia Baroque (San Francisco); Handel and Haydn Society and Boston Baroque (Boston); The American Classical Orchestra (New York); the Smithsonian Chamber Orchestra (Washington, DC); and Santa Fe Pro Musica. Mr. Schachman taught for many years at Vassar College and at the Baroque Performance Institute at Oberlin College, and is currently on the faculty of the School of Music at Boston University. On the modern oboe, Mr. Schachman performs with the New York Chamber Soloists and the Orchestra of St. Lukes.

Musicologist **Kai Christiansen** will offer a free pre-concert talk at 6 PM in the Kohl Mansion Library.
